John Eldon Olson died peacefully Monday, July 22, 2013 at Capital Regional Medical Center in Tallahassee, FL. Graveside services will be held on Saturday, July 27, 2013 at 11:00 AM at Riverside Cemetery. Visitation will be held Friday, July 26, 2013 at Kimbrell-Stern from 6:00PM until 8:00PM.

A native of Shenandoah, Iowa, Mr. Olson was a veteran of World War II, serving in the United States Navy. He met Anne Sheppard Curtis on a blind date in Atlanta and they were married June 18, 1950 at First United Methodist Church in Albany. While raising his family and being an active charter member of Westminster Presbyterian Church, he worked at Georgia Electric Company over 30 years. He was active in the Albany Exchange Club, Golden "K" Kiwanis Club, Anchorage Board, Lord's Pantry Board and the Gideons. In his later years, he was an active member in First United Methodist Church and attended the Fellowship Sunday School Class.

Anyone who knew him would agree that he led an exemplary life for 86 years. What a teacher! He was always joyful, cool, calm and collected. He didn't run fast and furious, but rather walked slow and deliberate.
