



Anita Pait Bacon

August 17, 1931 - July 3, 2022

Anita Pait Bacon died peacefully at The Oaks at Oakland Plantation on Sunday, July 3, 2022, at the age of 90.

A graveside service officiated by Father Raymond G. Levreault, V.F. will be held at Crown Hill Cemetery on Thursday, July 7, at 10:00 AM. The family will receive friends following the service.

A native of Albany, GA, Anita was the first child of Myers Eugene Pait and Louise Prevatte Pait Ashton. She was preceded in death by her parents and husband, James Lewis (Jimmy) Bacon, Jr., to whom she was married for 68 years.

She is survived by her three children: Bernadette Bacon Kirkland and her husband, Michael, of Highlands, NC, James Lewis Bacon, III and his wife, Gina, of Warwick, GA, and Lacy Bacon Meier and her husband, John, of Woodstock, GA; six grandchildren: Curt Hall, Michael Kirkland, Jr. (Kristine Norton), Andrew Kirkland, Jim Kirkland, Ashley Meier Boswell (Jake), and Mariel Meier Nelson (Billy); three great-grandchildren: Hannah Hall, Pait Hatcher, and Kayden Nelson; siblings Myers Eugene Pait II and Lacy Pait Lee and her husband Spencer, and brother-in-law Dr. William H. (Bill) Bacon, all of Albany.

Anita was a graduate of Albany High School's Class of 1948. She attended Huntingdon College in Montgomery, AL, and had been accepted to the University of Georgia, but a sudden and serious eye condition prevented her from enrolling. She began dating Jimmy and they married at Albany's historic St. Teresa's Catholic Church, Anita having converted to Catholicism. Those early years of marriage found her caring for both her brother "Bubba" and baby sister, Lacy, while her mother received polio treatment at Warm Springs Rehabilitation Center. Decades of selfless care-giving to members of her family would become the hallmark of Anita's life.

Committed to raising their three children while Jimmy traveled with his job, Anita found time for favorite pastimes such as playing Bridge, decorating the priests' rectory at St. Teresa's for the holidays, joining friends and their families for summer swims at The Camp, creating beautiful garments and decorative items on her sewing machine or art table, and compiling treasured scrapbooks of recipes, photographs, and memorabilia of her family's lives. She was an active member of the Junior League of Albany, serving as its President and appearing in JLA's popular "Follies" theatrical productions.

With her children almost grown, Anita returned to her education at Albany Technical School, where she completed the secretarial sciences program. She was hired by Citizens and Southern Bank as executive secretary to Vice President Ed Freeman. Anita considered those many years at C&S to be some of her happiest, with dear friends Betty Cannon and Merrel Callaway working just "across the lobby." Upon retirement from C&S Bank, she followed in her mother's footsteps and began working with the Dougherty County Board of Elections, supporting a number of municipal and county elections over the years.

Anita was a woman of many talents who loved sharing her gifts with others. She was a marvelous seamstress whose masterpieces included dresses for her girls, cocktail attire, prom gowns, and pageant costumes, as well as draperies and multiple home décor items. Anita was renowned for baking the best pound cakes ever, in addition to being an excellent cook in every way. She enjoyed having drinks each evening with Jimmy on the patio and hosting family get-togethers, always with a packed house! When her mother passed away Anita became the reigning matriarch of the extended Prevatte family, and all her life was the "very special" aunt to her nieces and nephews and their families. She was an accomplished, self-taught artist whose paintings graced the walls of her longtime home with Jimmy and her apartment at The Oaks. In recent years she enjoyed gathering with a special group of friends called "The Mondays."

The family is most appreciative of the loving care given to Anita during her three-plus years living at The Oaks, and is especially grateful for the devotion and attention shown by Salena Metcalf, Virginia Dawson, Leather Western, and Annie Pearl Lewis during that time.
