Aynn Kirtley Phillips, age 95, died on Saturday, December 1, 2018, at her home in Albany, Georgia .

She was born in Lebanon, Tennessee on May 27, 1923, the daughter of James Addison Kirtley , PhD., and Mary Maude DuVal Kirtley. She was preceded in death by her husband, John Temple Phillips, Jr. , who died in 2007.

Mrs. Phillips is survived by her three children and their spouses:

Mrs. Phillips was a 1939 graduate of Central High School in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. She graduated from the Tennessee College for Women in 1942 and sang in the Women's Glee Club. After graduation she attended Middle Tennessee State College and obtained a certification to teach Elementary and High School English. After college she worked at Sewart Air Force Base in Smyrna, Tennessee during World War II. She met John Phillips while he was stationed there before his tour of duty in Italy. Four years later they married and moved to Albany, Georgia.

Mrs. Phillips was a long time member of Porterfield Memorial United Methodist Church. She loved being a part of the Ladies Circle 4 and the Intercessory Prayer Group. She was a member of the Alpha Sunday School class.

Mrs. Phillips was an avid Bridge player and had lifelong friends who played Bridge together every Thursday for 50 years. She was in the Town and Country Garden Club. Mrs. Phillips spent many years researching the genealogy of both her parents' family lines as well as several of the Phillips family trees. She was a member of the Albany Town Committee of the National Society of the Colonial Dames of America and served as Town Chairman as well as Candidates' Helper for genealogical lines. Mrs. Phillips not only enjoyed her time as a Sunday School teacher for her children's and many adult classes, but also also taught a Bible class for many years with the Christian Women's Club. Mrs. Phillips was a founding member of the Albany Junior League. She was active in the Junior Service League and the Hospital Auxiliary and served as an Easter Seals volunteer. She was a former board member of the Salvation Army. She enjoyed being a Girl Scout leader for her daughters and a Cub Scout den mother for her son. She and Mr. Phillips were active in the support of Young Life, serving on the first committee in Albany. Many nieces and nephews, cousins and close friends remember Mrs. Phillips's wonderful hospitality not only in her home around her dining table but also on the many trips to the beach with family and friends. We will all miss her sweet smile and her insight into life that she so willingly shared with others. Her deep faith in the Lord was evident in her willingness to share words of scriptural wisdom with others. She reminded us always to put on love, to think of others first, and above all, to keep a good attitude.
