

Mr. D. Francis Dasher Sr. September 10, 1936 - November 18, 2018

Francis Dasher, 82, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and brother, passed away peacefully at his home in Albany on Sunday, November 18, 2018, following a lengthy illness.

Francis was born and raised in Valdosta, Georgia. He received his degree in chemical engineering from Georgia Institute of Technology in 1960 and began his career with Proctor and Gamble in Cincinnati and San Francisco. In 1969 Francis was hired by M&M Mars, where he worked in both Albany and Chicago. He held various positions, including production director and Vice President of both manufacturing and service and finance. Francis began his career as a Certified Financial Planner in 1982. He was the president and owner of Financial Advisors, Inc., and later Dasher & Padgett.

Francis was a devoted member of the Church of Christ, where he enjoyed teaching Sunday School and served as either a Deacon or Elder at the many congregations of which he was a member. He served as Chairman of the Board of South Georgia Christian Academy, treasurer of the Thronateeska Heritage Foundation, and both treasurer and president of the Dougherty County Kiwanis Club, of which he was a proud member for many years. Before his illness, Francis enjoyed reading, travel, golf, and sailing. Most of all, he enjoyed being Papa to his family. His wit and wisdom will be missed by many. Francis was preceded in death by his parents, Donovan Oscar and Fannie Wisenbaker Dasher. He is survived by his loving wife of 60 years, Gay Philips Dasher; 3 children: Kathy Dasher (Peter), Donovan Dasher, Jr., and Alan Dasher (Lisa); 5 grandchildren: Paul Zanardo (Amy), Steven Zanardo, Trey Dasher (Ben), Devon Jones (Aaron), and Morgan Dasher; 3 great grandchildren; his sister, Myra Anderson (Homer); and his brothers: Steve Dasher (Sally) and Richard Dasher.

Francis's ancestors emigrated from Austria and Germany to Georgia, where they established the town of Ebinezer in the early 1700s. His remains will be placed at the Dasher Cemetery near Valdosta, where his parents and many ancestors are buried. A private memorial service for the family will be planned at a later date.
