Marlene Eskeli Duke

Marlene E. Duke was born on February 7, 1934 in Oriska, North Dakota to Axel and Dorothy Tougas Eskeli. She was baptized on April 10, 1938 in St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Oriska, ND. Her Godparents were her Grandparents Arthur and Melvina Tougas. She passed away at 85 years old on February 14, 2019.

Marlene moved to Oregon with her family in 1938. In 1948 they moved again, this time to St. Ignatius, Montana. Marlene attended seven different high schools and graduated in 1952 from Chehalis High, Chehalis, Washington. She moved to Portland, Oregon, went to work for Minneapolis Honeywell and attended business school at night. In February 1954 she joined the U. S. Air Force. After basic training she attended Personnel Specialist training at Scott Air Force Base in Columbia, Illinois. She was then assigned to the 3241 Test Squadron at Eglin Air Force Base in Ft. Walton Beach, Florida. This, Marlene said, was the best move of her life as this is where she met the love of her life, John Duke of Albany, Georgia. Marlene and John married 5 months after meeting, on St. Patrick's Day, 1957. Marlene said they had great years together, six children, fourteen grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren.

Instead of a honeymoon, John and Marlene purchased a boat and had a boat of their lives together. As the family grew, they eventually bought a pontoon boat that carried 15 passengers - great for the Flint River and weekend outings with the grands.

Marlene and John also were members of the U.S. Power Squadron. The squadron taught safe boating courses at Darton for a number of years. Marlene was commander of the squadron in 2000.

In 1962 they made another move, this time to Albany, Georgia. Marlene went to work as benefits administrator for Merck, Inc. She retired after 29 years. Much time was spent volunteering. She volunteered for 11 years with Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. Other agencies she volunteered with were American Red Cross, Hospice of Albany, Birthright of Albany, and St. Clare's Soup Kitchen. She was a member of the Albany Chorale prior to her illness.

Marlene was preceded in death by her parents, brothers Darwin and Kurt Eskeli both of

Albany, Oregon, her husband, John, and a grandson, Guy Tanner.
