



## Alice Jeanell Clark Obituary

February 25, 1948 - May 22, 2006

Alice Jeanell Clark, 58, of Albany, died Monday, May 22, 2006 at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. Her funeral service will be THURSDAY 1 PM at Kimbrell-Stern with interment to follow at Westview Cemetery, Moultrie, GA. The Rev. Dawes P. "Buck" Thomson will officiate. Alice was born February 25, 1948 to Martha and C. B. Clark. Alice will be remembered for her outgoing personality and for the love and affection she generously gave to everyone. Alice was the inspiration for the first group of parents meeting which led to the formation of the Albany Association for Retarded Citizens. She was one of the first children to attend Happy House, which grew into what is now Primus Industries. It was because of Alice Clark that the Dougherty County School System provided special education classes several years ahead of other schools in Georgia. In spite of her Down Syndrome disability, Alice led a very worthwhile and meaningful life. Her father died in 1970. She is survived by her mother: Martha Clark, Albany; a brother: Dr. David Clark and his wife Amy, St. Louis, MO, and a host of loving cousins.
