



## Allen F. Davis Obituary

June 23, 1917 - July 11, 2004

Mr. Allen Fleming Davis, 87, died at home on Sunday, July 11, 2004. Mr. Davis was born in Quitman, Georgia in 1917 and moved to Albany in 1923. He was a graduate of the University of Georgia where he was a member of Sigma Nu Fraternity. Mr. Davis was a member of the Albany Rotary Club for 55 years, a Past Commander of the American Legion Post 30 and Chef de Gare Voiture of the Forty and Eighth. Mr. Davis served in the Pacific theater during WWII as Captain, U.S. Army, receiving 2 Bronze Stars and 1 Silver Star for gallantry in action. He and his brother, J. I. Davis, Jr., owned and managed the Davis Farm Contracting Co. for many years. Mr. Davis also served as a superintendent of the City of Albany's Public Works Dept. He served two terms on the Albany City Commission, was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, a member of First United Methodist Church for 65 years and of Porterfield United Methodist Church for the last 16 years.
