For years, Lindsey and Amy took Eloise and my Aunt Helen Rushton (after Uncle Walter's death) out to eat on Friday. Lindsey was such a gentleman. After Lindsey's death, the three ladies continued the tradition of eating out on Friday nights. They all three looked forward to the outing. Those three ladies went to church together on Sunday nights as well. Eloise and Amy shared many good times. They seemed more like sisters than friends, but friends they were indeed! They were the kind of friends that could stop in unannounced and be welcome and could share whatever was on their mind without fear it would be repeated. I am sure they solved many of life's problems as they drank coffee and shared. After Amy quit getting out so much, Eloise would sometimes pick up a sandwich and take it over to share with Amy. Their visits got fewer and further between in the latter years, but they so enjoyed their visits. The very last visit between them was just a couple of months before Eloise passed away (she died in December 2012) when my cousin Martha English McLeod took Mama by to see Amy. She took a picture of the two friends and it is so very special. I will get the family a copy. I only visited Mrs. Amy a few times while she was in the nursing home, but each time I saw her she told me that she had lost her very best friend (Eloise). I thank God for our friendship with the Patton family. Many fun times were spent with you children. May God bless you all as this chapter closes for you. You were indeed blessed to have

such devoted and loving parents and we were blessed with dear dear friends.
