



Beverley Weatherly Obituary

June 29, 1917 - February 20, 2010

Born in Winchester, Idaho, Mrs. Weatherly was raised in Corvallis, Oregon and attended Oregon State University where she hosted a popular classical music program on the college radio station. Moving to Honolulu, Hawaii in the late 1930's, Beverley gravitated to working at an exclusive import shop where she met her husband of 66 years, a young Navy machinist, Neal Weatherly of Leesburg, Georgia. A woman of many varied interests and talents, Mrs. Weatherly taught ceramics and crafts for the City of Albany at the Wigwam in Tift Park, served for many years on the Altar Guild of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, as president of the Lee County Historical Society she was the driving force in publishing the well-received "A History of Lee County, Georgia", and enjoyed reading, writing and painting. She and her husband were members of the Flint River Power Squadron where she learned to dock their houseboat. Always putting her family first, Beverley traveled from coast to coast more than twelve times to always meet the ship when her husband put into port during World War II. She joined her husband in operating Patch Nursery and Woodland Mobile Home Park in Leesburg and her children and grandchildren in their endeavors. She was preceded in death by her husband Emmitt Neal Weatherly Sr., her brother Russell Vaughn, her sister, Maxine V. Darvey, and her parents Max B. Vaughn and Alma Ratcliff Vaughn
