Captain Billy (Bill) Hawkins Kuykendall, USMC (Ret.), 88, went home to be with the Lord on October 14, 2022.

His funeral service will be at 2 PM on Saturday, October 22, 2022 at the graveside at Crown Hill Cemetery with military honors. The family will receive friends prior to the service at Kimbrell-Stern beginning at 1:00-1:45 PM.
