Carol Tye Dozier of Albany died Tuesday, Feb. 13, 2024 peacefully at her home. A native Albanian, Mrs. Dozier was born on March 1, 1933 to Dr. James Pearce Tye and Juneil Gunnels Tye. She was an honor graduate from Albany High School in 1950 and from Agnes Scott College in 1954. Mrs. Dozier was a member of First Methodist Church since 1957 and a member of the Fellowship Sunday School Class. She had been an active member of both the Junior League of Albany and the Charity League of Albany in which her father was the founder. She was an active member of the YMCA since childhood. Mrs. Dozier was preceded in death by her parents, her husband of 60 years, Donald Wilson Dozier, and her brother James Pearce Tye.

Mrs. Dozier is survived by her three children, Anne Raybun Dozier Spelts (Franklin) of Albany, Donald Wilson Dozier, Jr. of Albany, and Neil Tye Dozier (Siggie) of Connecticut. She had two granddaughters, Dr. Raybun Carol Spelts of Atlanta and Dr. Anna Franklin Spelts Helmecci (Dean) of Richmond Hill and two great-granddaughters.
