Charles Edwin Jones, 85, of Albany, died Saturday, June 21, 2008 at his home. His funeral service will be MONDAY (Today) 10 AM at Crown Hill Cemetery. The Rev. Tom Pollock and Mr. Ross Powell will officiate. The family will visit with friends following the service. Charles Edwin Jones was born November 3, 1922 in Booneville, MS to Charles Heber and Emma Bell Gordon Jones. He moved to Albany in 1928 and was raised on Blue Springs Plantation. He graduated from Albany High School in 1940 and attended Baylor in Chattanooga, TN and Auburn University in Auburn, AL where he was a member of Kappa Alpha Fraternity. In April 1943, Ed joined the US Army and served in the 88th. Division, L Company, 350th Infantry in Italy. He was discharged in December 1945 and returned to Albany and married his high school sweetheart, Doris Evelyn McCamy on June 15, 1946. Ed was an insurance adjuster until he retired in 1990 and worked with horses at Nilo Plantation until present time. He was a member of Sherwood Baptist Church. He was preceded in death by a grandson: Curt Inman. He is survived by his wife: Doris McCamy Jones, Albany; a daughter: Jerrie Jones Bledsoe and her husband Beau, Albany; a son: Lance Edwin Jones and his wife Helen, Albany; granddaughters: Lynn Inman Pflapsen and her husband Keith, Albany, Elizabeth Bledsoe, Panama City, FL, Madison Jones, Albany; 2 great grandchildren: Sara Pflapsen and Curt Pflapsen, both of Albany.
