David Williams McEwen, 59, of Albany, died February 20, 2005 at his home after a three year illness. The son of the late Gerald W. and Gene McEwen, Mr. McEwen was born in Morristown, NJ and lived in both New Jersey and Florida before settling with his family in Albany in 1987. Mr. McEwen attended the University of Florida and the University of Georgia before receiving a BA in English and a Masters of Education from Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, FL. Mr. McEwen worked as a Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor for the State of Florida for 14 years. In Albany he was employed as a Human Resources Director for Burlington-Northern Motor Carriers and then as HR Director at Flint River Textiles for 11 years. Mr. McEwen then taught Social Studies at Stephens County Middle School in Stephens County, GA before returning to Albany in 2003. He was a member of St. Paul's in Albany for over 18 years. He was also a member of the Deerfield Beach F&A.M. Lodge #325 in Deerfield Beach, FL since 1972, was a former president of the YMCA in Gulf Breeze, FL and served with various community and civic organizations throughout New Jersey, Florida and Georgia. He was also President of B.I.O.Y.A. Survivors include his wife, Mari P. McEwen of Albany, his son and daughter-in-law Bradford G. and Shambly Tay McEwen of Albany.
