Dorothy Smith Davis, 92, died Thursday, May 2, 2019 in Griffin, GA.

Dorothy grew up in the depression so she was very frugal. She didn't believe in waste and didn't hesitate to tell you if she thought you were wasting things. She drank coffee in the morning and Tang. She loved Tang! She drank it every day. She loved to read. Her daughter checked out books from the library for her and she read four books every two weeks. She believed in following through on things promised and was consistent. She went to bed at 10pm. She said that was bedtime and it didn't really matter if the movie was over or

not.

Her great-grandson, Marcus shared that she was always willing to listen. Even if the subject was something she might not have known about she was always willing to learn. She also always had time to help you try to figure out a solution to a problem.

She loved watching Wheel of Fortune, Jeopardy and Days of our Lives.

One of her favorite sayings when a child questions, why, why, why? She said, "Cat-fur-to-make-kitten-britches".

She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband. She is survived by 2 children: a daughter, Carol Davis Gable and a son, Marvin Edward Davis (Marta); 5 Grandchildren: Laura (Juan), Julie (Adam), Michael, Monica (Eric), Matthew (Kelley); 10 Great-Grandchildren: Marcus, Malik, Aiden, Emmerson, Madden, Luca, Londyn, Laila, Jax and Jace.
