



## Elizabeth W. Landrum Obituary

September 12, 1917 - December 1, 2010

Elizabeth Weatherly Landrum, 93, of Leesburg died Tuesday December 1, 2010 at the home of her daughter in Rocky Face, Georgia. Mrs. Landrum was born September 12, 1917 in Greenville, AL, daughter of the late Fielding Elimus Weatherly and Allie Mae Pepper. She was married to the late Chester H. Landrum and lived in the Albany area most of her life. She graduated from Brenau College, during the Great Depression. Mrs. Landrum taught school in Sasser, GA, and worked at a weather station in Pensacola, FL, but she spent most of her years employed as a histologist at what is now Sumter Regional Hospital in Americus, GA. She was a member of Leesburg United Methodist Church. Survivors include Hal Landrum and his wife Nina of Marietta, their children Aislinn Iaizzi and James Landrum; Jean Cook of Albany, and her children Frances Foor and Deborah Bailey; Betty Whiddon and her husband Royce of Rocky Face, and their children Shannon Leaper, Alex Phillips, Kelson, Wesley, Megan, and Pepper Whiddon; and Mary Roark and her husband Alan of Philadelphia, their son Collin; and a brother Fred Weatherly of Alpharetta. Nine great-grandchildren also survive. Elizabeth always saw both sides of an argument, sometimes to her own frustration. She was strong, compassionate, and devoted to her family.
