Mrs. Bates received her bachelor's degree from Valdosta State College, Master's degree from Oglethorpe University and Specialist Degree in Reading from the University of Georgia. She taught in school systems in Guam, Germany, and several systems in Georgia including Dougherty County where she was also the County Reading Supervisor. She was a charter member and past president of the Albany Area Council of the International Reading Association, and a member of the Phi Kappa Honor Society at the University of Georgia. She received a Certificate of Honor from Delta Kappa Gamma Society and was a member of the Kappa Delta Phi Education Society. Mrs. Bates was recognized in the Personalities of the South publication for her contributions to education. She was also recognized in the Cambridge England publication of International Who's Who of Intellectuals. She served as President of the Dougherty County Teacher's Association and President of Delta Kappa Gamma XI Chapter. She was recently honored by the Georgia Retired Education Association as one of nine Emeritus Members from Dougherty County. After retiring from the Dougherty County School System, she and her grandson owned and operated Antiques Plus for over ten years. She was a member of First Baptist Church of Albany. Born in Arlington, GA, to Mr. and Mrs. James M. Giddens, she was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Lt. Col William H. Bates, Sr. (1998) of Covington, GA and her sister, Catheryn Giddens (1957). Survivors include her son and daughter-in-law, Dr. and Mrs. William H. Bates, Jr. of Albany, her grandson, William H.

Bates, III of Charleston, South Carolina, and her granddaughter, Bronwyn G. Bates of New York City.
