



Mr. George Francis Hobaugh Obituary

February 14, 1930 - December 21, 2013

George Francis Hobaugh, 83, of Albany, died Saturday, December 21, 2013.

His memorial service will be at 11 AM on Friday, December 27, 2013 at Covenant Presbyterian Church. The Rev. Dr. William "Biff" Coker will officiate. Mr. Hobaugh's cremated remains will be buried in a private service at Andersonville National Cemetery with full military honors.

Mr. Hobaugh was born in Franklinville, NC, and moved to Albany in 1965. He was a member of Covenant Presbyterian Church and served as an Elder. He was a member of the Albany Rotary Club and the Club Managers Association of America, where he earned the ranking of Certified Club Manager. Mr. Hobaugh retired from the United States Marine Corps as a First Lieutenant in 1968 with 20 years of service. He landed at Inchon and went with the First Marine Division to the Chosin Reservoir. While in Albany, he was the general manager of Doublegate Country Club, Merry Acres Restaurant, and Stonebridge Golf and Country Club. Mr. Hobaugh was preceded in death by his wife Rebecca Gardner Hobaugh.

He is survived by his son: Jeffrey Francis Hobaugh (Pascale), Macon; his daughter: Jennifer Hobaugh Lansbury, Springfield, VA; his brother: Elmer Hobaugh, Greensboro, NC; his 2 grandchildren: Jeremy Gardner Hobaugh, Atlanta, Anna Gardner Buddin, Springfield, VA.

The family will receive friends at Kimbrell-Stern on Thursday, December 26, 2013 from 6-7:30 PM.
