



Glynn M. Hatcher Obituary

October 15, 1943 - March 24, 2003

Though he spent a career traveling the world, Glynn Hatcher always knew he would return to Albany for his retirement. That was never in doubt, said Teresa Hatcher, Glynn's wife of 34 years. He truly loved South Georgia and after he retired he often took visitors on tours of the back roads of the area. Glynn Martin Hatcher died Monday evening, March 24, of complications from cancer. Glynn Hatcher was born in Elmodel, Georgia on October 15, 1943, the son of C.E. Hatcher, a farmer and businessman and Agnes Faircloth Hatcher, a school teacher. His childhood was spent in Baker County where he often sat at the end of a field row watching his father plow behind a mule. Glynn Hatcher was the youngest of six children including two girls who doted on him. He was the baby and they looked after him, said Teresa Hatcher. He was always close to his brothers and sisters. The Hatcher children enjoyed an idyllic country life of swimming and fishing in creeks when not doing farm chores. He really loved to recall his boyhood days in Baker County, said his daughter, Michelle Hatcher Hester of Gadsden, Alabama. He was deeply interested in our family history and for him that's where it all began. The Hatcher home features family portraits dating back to the turn of the Twentieth Century. Glynn Hatcher spent a 17-year career in the U.S. Air Force which sent him all over the world and throughout America. He retired after rising to the rank of Master Sergeant. His military service instilled in him a profound sense of patriotism. He put the American flag out in front of the house every morning and brought it in every

evening, said Teresa Hatcher. And I think his patriotism included a fascination with politics. He enjoyed watching politics on television and discussing it with his friends. Like many retired military men, Glynn Hatcher liked to live an orderly life, a fact which sparked mischief in his daughter. He liked to keep everything in its place, said Michelle Hatcher Hester. The telephone sat just so by his chair and pens, ashtrays and magazines all had their place. Sometimes when he left the room I would move them around and he'd notice it as soon as he walked back in and he'd put them back where they belonged. We'd all laugh.
