Harriett Thomas Robinson 83, of Albany, died Saturday at Palmyra Medical Center following an illness. Her funeral service will be 11 AM, Wednesday, January 2, 2008 at the Chapel of Sherwood Baptist Church with entombment to follow in Crown Hill Mausoleum. The family will receive friends at 10 AM until the hour of service. Rev. Tom Pollock and Mr. Ross Powell will officiate. A native of North Georgia Mrs. Robinson has lived in Albany most of her life. She was a member of Sherwood Baptist Church and she retired from Civil Service at the Marine Corps Logistics Base with more than 20 years of service. The delights of her life were that of her grandchildren, her flowers, reading, gardening, and shopping. In earlier years of her life she served her duty as a Cub Scout Den Mother and was the keeper of the family. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, William Henry Robinson; her brother Hugh Thomas, and her step-daughter Wareen Robinson Sawyer. Survivors include; 2 sons: Neil Robinson of Albany, and Stephen Robinson and his wife Jan of Leesburg; her step-son, Harvey Robinson and his wife Ruth of Albany; 9 grandchildren; 15 great-grandchildren; 1 great-great-grandchild; 3 sisters: Helen Thomas Crone of FL.
