She was reared in Albany, was an honor graduate from Albany High in 1936, and earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Georgia in Athens. Jane was particularly proud of her entrepreneurial father, Louie Acker, who left behind a legacy of accomplishments in Albany including an entire subdivision with streets named after his family: Pearl Avenue, Jane Lane, Sharon Avenue, Gail Avenue and Acker Drive. She is survived by her husband of forty years, Raymond L. Clark of Merritt Island, FL, her two daughters, Sharon G. Sutton and her husband Ernest of Melbourne, FL, A. Gayle Stapp and her husband Jim of Cocoa Beach, FL, her four grandchildren, K. Dorn Williamson, Christopher A. Williamson, Candice Jane Bartell and Darby R. Bryan and two great-grandchildren.
