Jerry L. Bennett died Monday, August 26, 2013 at Magnolia Manor Nursing Home. A memorial service will be held Wednesday, August 28, 2013 at Kimbrell Stern at 11:00 AM with visitation starting an hour prior to the service at 10:00AM. Rev. John Spence will officiate.
