



John H. Glenn, Jr. Obituary

August 29, 1918 - February 23, 2003

A native of Pelham, Mr. Glenn moved to Albany in 1940 to work with First State Bank, now Regions Bank. After serving in the U S Navy during World War II, Mr. Glenn returned to First State and retired as Senior Vice President in 1984. During his 57 year membership in First Baptist Church, Mr. Glenn taught a men's Sunday Scholl class and served on the Board of Deacons. He was a member of the Albany Lions Club for many years serving 2 terms a president, an active member and President of the Albany JAYCEES and active in the Georgia and American Bankers Associations. He was preceded in death by two brothers Carl E. Glenn and Roy E. Glenn.
