John Wesley Owens, 89 of Valdosta, GA died Saturday, October 14, 2006 at the Presbyterian Nursing Home in Quitman, GA. A native of Grady County, Mr. Owens had lived in Valdosta and Albany, returning to Valdosta four years ago. He was a member of the Liberty Parkway Church of God, formerly Eighth Avenue Church of God, for seventy-five years. He was retired from the maintenance department at Flint River Cotton Mill where he worked for fifty years. He had also worked with Bruno's for eight years and was a US Army veteran of World War II.
