



John Walter Starr, Sr. Obituary

January 5, 1922 - January 29, 2007

Mr. Starr was born in Brunswick, GA on January 5, 1922. He graduated from Albany High School in 1939 and from North Georgia College in 1942. He was a decorated pilot during World War II and flew with the 307th Bomb Group, Dutch East Indies. After the war, he attended the University of North Carolina and received a Master of Applied Social Sciences degree from Western Reserve University in Cleveland, OH. For two years he directed the Family Service in High Point, NC. He later moved to Macon to work with the Federal Probation Office. In 1952 he moved to Albany where he became a partner in Albany Typewriter Exchange. After retirement from the office equipment company, he worked in the Career Development Department of Darton College. He was a faithful member of the First United Methodist Church, a member and past president of the Fellowship Sunday School class, and a past member of the official board. He was a past member of the Daugherty County Kiwanis Club. A talented artist, he was a member, past president, and honorary life member of the Georgia Artist Guild of Albany. His paintings hang at First United Methodist Church, Darton College, and in the homes of numerous family members and friends. He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Mary Caroline Smith Starr; a sister, Mary Laura Starr Martin of Shellman; two children, Dr. John Walter Starr, III of Roanoke, VA and his wife Lynda; and Susan Starr Woolbright of Roswell, GA and her husband Ed; five grandchildren, Caroline Starr Bailey and her husband Chris, Amy Starr Redwine and her husband Derek, John Andrew Starr, Stephanie Woolbright
