Julius T. Klein, 93, of Lee County, died Saturday, March 23, 2019 at Magnolia Manor in Americus, GA.

His memorial service will be at 11:00 AM on Friday, March 29, 2019 at the graveside at Crown Hill Cemetery. Mr. Ben Bridges will officiate. Military Honors will be provided by the Walter H. Burt American Legion Post 30.

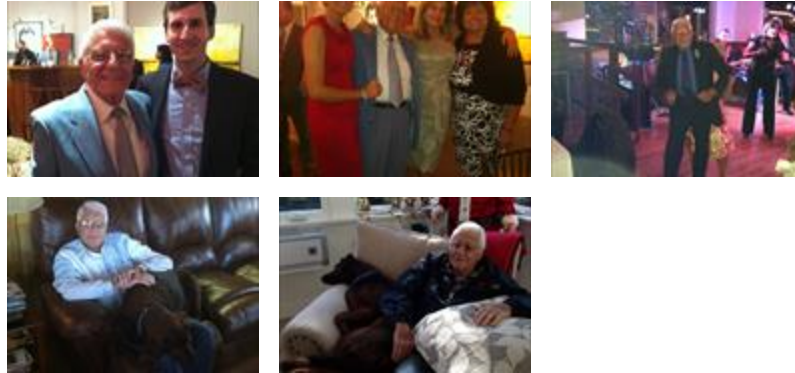
