June was a native Albanian and lived in Albany all of her life except for eleven years when she worked for the Metropolitan Atlanta Chapter of the American Red Cross. She worked on numerous national disasters throughout the South East. June was presented with the American National Red Cross Tiffany award, for employee excellence while in Atlanta. June retired from the Red Cross after 29 years of service with 18 of them being as Executive Director of the Albany Chapter. After her retirement she worked part time for the SOWEGA council on aging as a fundraising consultant and project coordinator for 10 years. She was recipient of the Southwest GA Older Worker of the year award in 2003. She graduated from Albany High School in 1946 and attended GSWC (Now Valdosta State College). She was a member of St Paul's Episcopal Church, former member of the Albany Junior League, member of the Association of American Red Cross retirees and honorary member of the Southwest GA American Red Cross Board of Directors. June is survived by two daughters, Jan Reynolds, Framingham, Mass., Pat Reynolds Rozar and her husband Steve, Opelika, Al. and one son William (Bill) Reynolds, Miami Fl, granddaughter, Victoria Naomi Reynolds and three grandsons, Clint Rozar(April), Dusty Rozar(Jessica) and James Reynolds. She also has three great grandchildren Ella, Ansley and Patric.
