Mrs. Frank Baker Rose, 89, of Albany, died Monday, November 14, 2005 at Lee County Health Care. The graveside service will be held at 2 PM Thursday at Crown Hill Cemetery with Mr. Ross Powell officiating. A native of Memphis, TN, Mrs. Rose graduated from Memphis State University, now known as Memphis University. Mrs. Rose was the first principle of Deerfield School. After leaving Deerfield, she taught 2nd grade in the Lee County School System until her retirement in 1975. Mrs. Rose was a member of Sherwood Baptist Church and the Home Connection Sunday School Class. Mr. and Mrs. Rose along with another couple started The Mission in downtown Albany through Sherwood Baptist Church in the 1960's. Mrs. Rose is survived by two sons: Jimmy Rose of Albany, and Shelton Rose and his wife Sandi of Franklin, TN; two grandchildren: Nicholas Shelton "Nick" Rose and Kristin Elizabeth Rose, both of Franklin, TN; a niece, Pat Rose Duggan and her husband Henry of Albany; and her many very special friends, who were thought more as family than friends.
