



Lisen G. Sundberg Obituary

February 15, 1911 - October 16, 2006

Brigadier Lisen G. Sundberg, Salvation Army, 95, of Albany, died Monday, October 16, 2006 at her home. Her funeral service will be THURSDAY 4 PM at Kimbrell-Stern with interment following at Floral Memory Gardens. Major Henry Hunter and Major Leonard Taylor will officiate. A native of Vannas, Sweden, Brigadier Sundberg had lived in Albany since 1962. She attended seminary in Stockholm, Sweden, and was commissioned into the Salvation Army in 1935. She and her husband, the late Brigadier John Alfred Sundberg started the Salvation Army in the Philippines in 1938 and remained there throughout the Japanese invasion and occupation, leaving in 1946. Following that, they served in the mission field all over the world. She retired from the Salvation Army in 1975. An accomplished musician, Brigadier Sundberg played at numerous religious events, and at many funerals while in the Albany area. She was preceded in death by her husband Brigadier John A. Sundberg. Survivors include her daughter: Annlies Cato and her husband Carey, Albany; 2 grandsons: Trey Cato and Colt Cato. Three caregivers became part of the family while helping Brigadier Sundberg: Cynthia Cross, Beverly Cullen, and Gwen Roberts, who died in May.
