



Louis Charles Schatz Obituary

Louis C. Schatz, 84, formerly of Albany died Friday, November 25, 2005 in Panama City Beach, Fl. A memorial service will be held Sunday, December 11, 1:00PM at Kimbrell-Stern. A native of New York, he served in the Navy Seabees during WWII, and moved to Albany in 1950. He was a successful businessman who owned the Albany Telephone Answering Service, and expanded it into surrounding states, becoming the Tri-State Message Center. Community involvement encompassed his life. In the early years, he was active in school PTAs, Civil Air Patrol and local business organizations. Notable was his dedication and long commitment to the Albany Little Theater and the Albany Museum of Art. He was a former member of Temple B'nai Israel. He shared his love and knowledge of sailing with his family and friends. He leaves a legacy of his intense love for life and learning, strong work ethic, wonderful appreciation of humor, and dedication and service to others. He is survived by his family: his wife, Sally Schatz, of Tarpon Springs, Fl; a son, Stephen Schatz of New Port Richey, Fl; daughters, Jo Ellen Bryant of Tarpon Springs, Fl and Jerri Lee Abrams of San Antonio, TX; 7 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.
