



## Lucinda Wolf Parsons

November 2, 1926 - December 6, 2022

Mrs. Lucinda Ellen (Wolf) Parsons, “Cindy”, 96, passed into the presence of her Savior Jesus Christ on December 6 th, 2022 at her place of residence in Lee County, Georgia. Cindy was born in 1926 in Andover, Kansas, a daughter of the late Clyde and Ruby Fern (Clark) Wolf and sister of the late Josephine (Wolf) Rowe and the late Leonard Wolf.

Cindy cherished memories of growing up on her parent’s farm near Piedmont, Kansas, as well as riding her horse to school, surviving the dust bowl, tending to her farm chores, enjoying the beautiful endless fields of sunflowers, and finally being old enough to go to the local dances where she met her future husband.

Cindy was united in holy matrimony to James (Jim) Alfred Parsons of Newcomerstown, Ohio in February 1946. Their union was blessed with 63 years of adventure in which they traveled to and lived in many different states and regions of the world during Jim’s military and civilian service in the U.S Army Air Corps and United States Air Force. The couple enjoyed decades of ballroom dancing, membership in the Audubon Society, quail and pheasant hunting, boating, fishing, traveling, and gathering with and hosting their many friends from near and far.

Known for her green thumb, love of birds, and artistic talents, Cindy was an

active member of the Radium Springs Garden Club, the Albany Garden Club, The Garden Club of Georgia, and the local Audubon Society. She judged flower show arrangements across the State. She was instrumental in establishing gardens at Grace Way Recovery Center in Albany. As a self-taught artist, she created sketches of historic Albany sites with fellow artist, the late Carol Blackshear.

Cindy was a committed volunteer at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital comforting and encouraging countless patients with her healing hand massages, freshly made milkshakes, and kind cheerful spirit. She was also an active member of Albany Bible Church and enjoyed attending ladies Bible Study at the home of the late Karen Smith.

A loving and caring person and devoted wife and friend to whom all she met, Cindy always considered the needs of others first and foremost. Her beautiful life, warmth as a hostess and keen wit will forever be cherished in the lives of her friends and relatives.

Cindy is survived by her nephews; Larry Wolf and wife Donna of Huntsville, Texas, Mark Wolf of Cottonwood, Minnesota, Richard Rowe and wife Anna of San Antonio, Texas and her nieces, Carol Allen of Refugio, Texas, Cindy Sue Olsburg of Mesa, Arizona, and many grand and great grand nephews and grand and great grand nieces.

The memorial service for our dear Cindy will be held at a later date at Albany Bible Church, with Pastor Pete Daughtry officiating. Interment will be at Andersonville National Cemetery, Andersonville, GA next to her husband Jim at a private ceremony.
