Mae Lucille Ogle Humber, 92, of Albany, GA born December 18, 1920, died April 28, 2013 at Willson Hospice House.

The memorial service will be Saturday May 4, 2013 11 AM at Kimbrell-Stern. Rev. Carrie Myers will officiate. Her remains will be cremated and scattered with her husbands.

A native of Akron, Ohio her parents were Nora Ann Lee and George Edward Ogle. She was a graduate of Westminster Choir College where she sang lead soprano with the school chorus. She came to Albany in 1943, as the Minister of Music for the First United Methodist Church of Albany and maintains her membership there. Later she went on to be the Minister of Music for St. Paul Episcopal Church, the Choir Director for the First Baptist Church of Camilla, GA and a member of the quartette at the Temple B'Nai Israel, and director of the Albany Chorus for many years. She touched many people's lives through her love for music. She retired from civil service with the closing of Turner Field Naval Air Station. She continued her secretarial skills by working for Daniel Construction Company while they were building Merck.

She was a devoted Wife, Mother, Grandmother, and Great grandmother.

She was preceded in death by her husband William Marcellus Humber, Jr.

Survivors include her sister, Ruth Ogle Carruthers of Beverly Hills, FL, daughter, Gena H. DeBary and her husband Ron of Albany; three grandchildren, Marcel DeBary of Smyrna, GA; Ronald O. DeBary Jr. and his wife Meredith of Woodstock GA; and (Sgt.) William H. DeBary of Marietta, GA; three great granddaughters, Georgia DeBary of Woodstock GA, Taylor and Samantha Simonette of Smyrna, GA.

She will be much missed by them all!

“ My family moved to Albany after Thanksgiving of 1948. I was eleven. Being Methodists, my parents, Luell and Morry Smith, took all three of their girls (Beverly, Sharon and Tina) to First Methodist Church ... the old sanctuary. When the choir rose to sing, there was a WOMAN directing. I didn't know a woman could direct! I had never seen such a thing. But that vision of her gave ME a vision!

Mrs. Humber was one of the first women at First Methodist to use me as her accompanist for gatherings in and outside the church. I was 14 or 15. Once she was singing for a group of women at McIntosh Elementary School. The heavy old upright was placed against the wall, and I could hear her, but could not see her. She later told Mother that God had given her daughter a special gift ... the gift of accompanying. That was the second vision she gave me.

A few years ago, I presented an organ/piano concert at FUMC and honored the women of Albany First Methodist who had shaped my life as a church musician. Mrs. Humber was one who did. 3 years ago, I retired after 55 years as Director of Music, Organist and Pianist in the Methodist Church. And Mrs. Humber was the FIRST to mentor me. I did write to tell her what she had meant to my life before the concert, but she was unable to attend. However, I was delighted to be able to thank her, in person, one morning ... at the Quickie! ~ Beverly
