Margie loved to travel and see new things - we know she is enjoying herself now. She died after a 6 year battle with ovarian cancer; she was brave and determined in her treatment of the disease. Margie's career included work as the Albany High School secretary and almost 20 years as a civil servant at the Albany Marine Corps Logistics Base from where she retired as a systems analyst. She received her bachelor's degree from Valdosta State College at the age of 60! Margie's travels included Greece, Russia, Mexico, Bermuda, Panama, Canada, Alaska, Hawaii, and numerous trips throughout Europe. She was also active in her church and community ♦ serving as an officer in the Albany Business Women's Association (ABWA) and as a member of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees (NARFE) Association.
