



Marion W. Maxwell Obituary

February 13, 1920 - March 16, 2004

A native of Grady County, he was a graduate of Cairo High School. After graduation, he worked in the funeral home in Cairo. He was an army veteran of WWII, serving in Iran. While stationed in Iran, he received a degree from Tehran University. Following the war, he graduated from John A. Gupton College of Funeral Service in Nashville, TN. He moved to Quitman, GA in 1946 and worked with Maxwell and Eason Funeral Home. He bought the funeral home in 1964 and retired in 1982. Mr. Maxwell was a member of the Georgia Funeral Directors Association. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Quitman, and he was a Past President of the Baptist Brotherhood. Mr. Maxwell was a Past President of the Quitman-Brooks County Chamber of Commerce and the Brooks County Housing Authority. He was preceded in death by his wife Elizabeth Hodges Maxwell.
