



Mary Anna Rogers Winderweedle Obituary

November 21, 1914 - October 29, 2004

Mrs. Mary Anna Rogers Winderweedle passed away on Friday, October 29, 2004 while residing in Canton, GA. The graveside service will be held at 11:15 AM on Monday, November 1, 2004 at Riverside Cemetery. Friends will be received at Kimbrell-Stern Funeral Directors from 10 AM until 11 AM on Monday morning. Mrs. Winderweedle was born in Houston County Alabama, and grew up in Dothan, AL. She relocated to Washington, DC in 1939 and worked for the federal government. During her 34 year career, she worked in Washington, DC, at the Naval Station in Buford, SC, the Naval Station in Jacksonville, FL, and for 20 years at the Marine Corps Logistics Base in Albany. Upon her retirement, she lived in Albany, Dothan and most recently, Canton, GA. While in Albany, she was a member of Byne Memorial Baptist Church, and Southside Baptist Church in Dothan, AL at her death. She was preceded in death by her husband, Wesley B. "Bill" Winderweedle and her son, Billy Joe Stuart. She is survived by her nephews: Paul Mullins of Ball Ground, GA, David Mullins of Leesburg and a niece Carole Mullins of Konia-Kaiu, HI. She is also survived by her sister, Anne Secrist, Clermont, FL and a sister-in-law, Diana Rogers, of Dothan, AL, other nieces and nephews include: Margy Miller, Clermont, FL, Jeff and Dawn Rogers of Dothan, George T. Rogers, Jr. of Atlanta, Betty Miller, of Dothan, Kenny Secrist of Maryland, Jim Secrist of Las Vegas, NV and a number of grand nieces and nephews.
