Mary Prevatte Wells, 90, died Monday, January 17, 2011 at her home in Vada, Georgia. Her funeral service will be Friday, January 21, 2011 at Sutton's Chapel United Methodist Church at 2 PM with visitation at 1 PM prior to the service. The Rev. Lynn Roberts will officiate. Interment will follow at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church in Vada. Mary spent her life caring for her family and the community of Vada. She was a devoted wife and homemaker, a retired secretary of the Pelham Elementary School, and an active member of Sutton's Chapel United Methodist Church.
