



Max A. Sheppard, Jr. Obituary

September 15, 1920 - February 21, 2003

Mr. Sheppard was born in Albany and lives his entire life here, attending Dougherty County schools and graduating from Albany High School in 1937. He served his country in World War II as a Signalman in the U.S. Navy. He worked as a lumber and hardware salesman starting with Crouch Lumber Company, then at Watkins Lumber Company and finally at Lowe's, all in Albany. Mr. Sheppard was a member of the First Baptist Church of Albany where he served as a deacon and was a life time member of American Post 30 serving in many capacities including Post Commander. He was also active in the Albany Chamber of Commerce for Many years serving on the Military Affairs Committee. He was preceded in death by his wife, Joelyn North Sheppard and a sister, Patty Sheppard Crawford.
