Maxwell F. Davis, 98, of Albany, died Thursday, March 09, 2023.

His funeral service will be at 1 PM on Saturday, March 11, 2023 at the graveside at Crown Hill Cemetery. The Rev. Butch Knight will officiate.

Mr. Davis was born in Worth County and had lived in Albany since 1948. He was a Deacon for over 60 years at Byne Memorial Baptist Church and First Baptist Church of Albany. He was a longtime volunteer with the Lord's Pantry and Baptist Builders. He was a master gardener. Mr. Davis was an Army veteran of WWII, serving in the European Theatre.
