



Merrel P. Callaway Obituary

July 10, 1921 - February 3, 2009

Merrel Purvis Callaway, 87, died February 3, at Palmyra Hospital. The son of Thomas James Callaway, Sr., and Minnie Purvis Callaway, he was born July 10, 1921 in Milstead, Georgia. He was a graduate of LaGrange High School and Emory University where he was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity. He served in the United States Navy during World War II. Mr. Callaway was Vice President and Senior Credit Analyst, and was responsible for Credit Administration at Citizens & Southern Bank from which he retired in 1986. Because of a strong community spirit and a lifetime dedication to Volunteerism, he was honored with the Harry Goldstein Lifetime Achievement Award for Volunteer of the Year and the American Red Cross Humanitarian of the Week award. The Thomasville Music and Drama Troupe honored him with a special award for longtime support in 2008; and he won the Exchange Club of Northwest Albany's Golden Deed Award, the service organization's most prestigious award honoring lifetime achievements in civic service. An active member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church where he was member of the choir for 30 years, he founded the Clothing Room which supplied uniforms for local elementary schools. He was active with the United Way, The Albany Museum of Art, the Sowega Council on Aging, and on the board of directors of The American Red Cross, Girls, Incorporated, Theatre Albany, the Albany Symphony and Albany Concert Association. He sang and danced his way through many musicals in Theatre Albany. He taught ballroom dancing and etiquette

for 25 years to Albany's sixth and seventh graders and served as the choreographer for the Albany Debutante Club for almost 20 years. He participated in the art scene with both time and financial commitments. He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother, Thomas James Callaway, Jr. and his brother-in-law, William Allen. Survivors include his sister, Mary Callaway Allen; his sister-in-law, Gladys Pace Callaway, of Albany; his nephews, Thomas James Callaway III and wife, Sherrie, of Thomasville, Georgia; Scott Allen and wife, Karen, and Richard Allen and wife, Janet, Marietta, GA; nieces, Cantey Callaway Tull and husband, Chris, of Charlotte, NC; Merrel Callaway Hattink and husband, Willem, of Atlanta, Georgia; Sandy Allen Gross and husband, Ken, of Cartersville, GA; Lori Allen of Salt Lake City, Utah; and many great nieces and great nephews. The Callaway Family would like to extend a special thanks to Mr. Callaway's very special friends, Will and Sue Carpenter, for their loyal service, support and devoted friendship for the last 10 years. Another special thank you goes to Jessica Riggins at Morningside and Evelyn Jones for their ever present care and attention. Kimbrell-Stern Funeral Directors will handle the funeral arrangements. The visitation will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in the Parish Hall, Friday, February 6 at 1 pm followed by the memorial service in the sanctuary at 2 pm. A graveside ceremony will be held immediately after the service for family and friends at Oakview Cemetery. “ During the early part of my banking career, which has spanned 30 years now, Merrel Callaway had a significant influence on formulating what, deep down, the direction was that I wanted my banking career to follow.

Of course, Glenn Creech, Reba Stewart, and the late Frank Deming all contributed their insights and philosophies to me, many of which I still apply to this day.

I first worked for Merrel for six months in 1979-80, not long after joining C&S. In my first meeting with him, he said "Unless it makes you feel uncomfortable, call me Merrel; everybody does". It was working under Merrel's experienced tutelage during this brief time that allowed me to apply what I had learned in college. And that was important to me.

But it was working for him again in the mid-1980s, prior to his retirement, that I really learned from Merrel. He drove home to me the importance of (A) thirsting for more knowledge regarding both finance and commercial credit administration, and (B) diversification in the application of what I already knew. But most importantly, Merrel taught me the importance of being driven to exceed the expectations of others. It is the objective of exceeding others' expectations of me in my work environment that has followed me throughout my career. That is something I strive to achieve every working day.

But I would be remiss if I didn't mention how much Merrel did after his retirement. His volunteer work with so many local agencies that provide for others set a benchmark and standard that few will be able to equal. In that regard, Merrel Callaway exceeded the expectations of all who knew him.
