My mother loved Muriel. He would often times come home to Marietta with me and spend time with my family, Mother did not necessarily think that Muriel was a good influence on me but she thought he was a good person and she loved and appreciated the bond that the two of us shared.

Muriel called me last year to set up a hunting trip. It would have been the first time we had seen each other in years. Life was a little busy at the time and I could not get away. Of course you know what I am going to say nowsure wish I had made time for that trip.
