



Oscar Prisant Obituary

March 18, 1921 - September 18, 2004

A native and lifelong resident of Albany, Mr. Prisant graduated from Albany High School in 1938. He graduated from the University of Georgia in 1942. He entered the US Army, 31st. Infantry, Company F after his graduation from college. He served in the European Theater during World War II. He went into Normandy on June 9, 1944 and became a prisoner of war. He was released on Sept. 7, 1944. During his army service, he received three Purple Hearts. Mr. Prisant was a member of Temple B'Nai Israel, and served on the Temple Board. He owned and operated Carolyn's Shoes in Albany. He was a member of the Walter H. Burt American Legion Post 30, the 40 & 8, a member of the Albany Jaycees, and the Elks Club.
