



Paul J Donahoe Lt. Col. Obituary

January 26, 1920 - February 9, 2004

A native of Sedalia, MO, Col. Donahoe joined the Air Force the day after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor. Upon graduation from flight school, he was selected to be a flight instructor at Moody AFB in Valdosta. He flew combat missions in World War II, transported troops during the Korean Conflict and was Operations Officer for a squadron in Vietnam. His military career included assignments in the Strategic Air Command at Biggs AFB in TX, a test pilot and Vice Commander at McDonnell Douglas Aircraft in Tulsa, OK and Program Manager for the Atlas Missile Program in Lincoln and Omaha, NE. He completed his military career as Procurement Management Director at Scott AFB in IL. Col. Donahoe retired to Albany in 1975 after having served his country for thirty-three and a half years. He was a member of St. Teresa's Catholic Church and was actively involved in the restoration of Old St. Teresa's Catholic Church on Residence Ave. in Albany. He was the development director for the Thronateeska Heritage Foundation and a member of the Knights of Columbus, Golden Kiwanis and president of the Military Officers Association of America.
