Captain Paul H. Morrissey (USMC, ret.), of Albany died Sunday February 3, 2008 at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. Funeral service will be held at 2 PM Friday, February 8, 2008 at Floral Memory Gardens with military honors. The Rev. Raymond G. Levreault will officiate. A native of South Glen Falls, New York, Captain Morrissey was retired from the United States Marine Corp after 22 years of service. During his military career he served in the Korean Conflict and Vietnam. Following his retirement from the Marine Corp, Captain Morrissey went to work for the city of Albany in the personnel department and retired after 22 years. He was a member of the Mustang Association, member of MOAA and was of the Catholic Faith. Survivors include his son Earl Morrissey and his wife Sarah of Albany, 2 grandchildren, Kristen and Laura Morrissey, sister, Helen Potter of S.
