



Paul B. Robertson Obituary

February 16, 1917 - June 21, 2004

A native of Brooklet, GA, and a graduate of Brooklet High School, Mr. Robertson received his BS degree from Georgia State University and his MA degree from Peabody University. He served four years in the United States Air Force during World War II and was honorably discharged as a 1st Lieutenant. Mr. Robertson moved to Albany in 1938 where he began coaching and teaching in the Albany School System. He served as principal of Albany Jr. High School from 1947 - 1970, assistant superintendent from 1971 - 1972 and superintendent from 1972 - 1986. Mr. Robertson was chosen as Outstanding Superintendent in Georgia from 1978 - 1979 and received Distinguished Service award in 1986 by the Georgia Association of Educational Leaders. He was a member of First United Methodist Church and the Hudson Malone Sunday School Class. Mr. Robertson also served as Chairman of the Administrative Board at First United Methodist and was also a Youth Director. He was a member and former president of the Albany Lions Club, former chairman of the Dougherty County Board of Health and a member and former president of the Albany Men's Garden Club. He also, served as member and president of the Albany Sports Hall of Fame, and was an avid tennis player and hunter.
