Mrs. Peggy Cullars Guillebeau of Albany, GA died on Tuesday, March 20, 2018 at her home. Her funeral service will be at 11 AM on Thursday, March 22, 2018 at Covenant Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Dr. William Coker officiating. The family will receive friends at Covenant Presbyterian Church on Thursday prior to the funeral beginning at 9:30 until the funeral hour.
