



Ray L. Godbee Obituary

Ray L. Godbee, Jr., 76, of Albany, died Monday, January 17, 2005 at his home following an illness. On January 17, 2005 at approximately 2:00 PM, Ray passed from this life on earth to his heavenly home to spend eternity with Jesus. His passing was without pain or suffering. Ray's loved ones and friends that he left behind all celebrate his passing because of their confidence in knowing that Ray is in a better place. Ray's family and friends that have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ look forward to the day when they will also pass from this life to have a reunion with Ray in Heaven.
