



Rembert L. McLendon, M.D. Obituary

December 20, 1931 - May 2, 2003

A native of Terrell County, Dr. McLendon was the son of the late Herbert Hodges McLendon and Frances Wall McLendon. After serving 4 years in the United States Air Force, he graduated from Abraham Baldwin College, University of Georgia and received his degree in Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from Georgia School of Veterinary Medicine and practiced veterinary medicine in Augusta. Dr. McLendon furthered his education by receiving his MD Degree from the Medical College of Georgia, then received his orthopedic training at Bowman Grey School of Medicine of Wake Forest University and Shriner's Hospital for Crippled Children in Greenville, SC. Dr. McLendon came to Albany in July, 1971 and joined Dr. John Meier in the practice of Orthopedic Surgery. After Dr. Meier's retirement in January 1978, he continued the practice of orthopedics as a solo practitioner until December 1996. He was also a volunteer with Easter Seal serving a number of years as medical director and also as the clinician for the amputee clinic for 20 years. Dr. McLendon was with the Children's Medical Services in Albany and served for a number of years as chief clinician. He was a member of Porterfield United Methodist Church, American Medical Association, Dougherty County Medical Society, Georgia Orthopedic Society, Southern Orthopedic Association, and a Fellow with the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgery. Dr. McLendon was a member of the Albany Rotary Club of which he was a Paul Harris Fellow, American Legion Post #30 and the Sons of the American Revolution.
