Mr. Richard Franklin Huggins, 56 of Longleaf Dr. in Leesburg died March 3, 2014 at his residence.

Funeral services will be Wednesday 11 AM at Kimbrell-Stern. Dr. Ron Holman officiating.

Richard was born at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital in Albany , attended public schools in Albany and graduated from Dougherty High School in 1975. He was an Eagle Scout and a member of First Baptist Church in Albany . He graduated from Albany Junior College in 1977 and the University of Georgia with a degree in finance in 1979.

He grew up in the family business, Huggins Outboard, Inc., and entered as a partner with his father in 1979, becoming a third generation marine dealer. In 1992, he became sole owner and president of the company.

Richard was an avid hunter, and sports enthusiast, especially the UGA Bulldogs. He enjoyed cookouts and spending time at the farm in Herod , GA with his close friends and family.

Survivors include his wife of 33 years, Virginia "Ginny" Gabel Huggins of Leesburg, his children, Matthew Lee Huggins, CPA and his wife Tara, Jennifer

Marie Huggins, Pharm.D., and Ashley Elizabeth Huggins all of Leesburg, parents, Bill and Nancy Huggins of Albany and his grandmother, Ruth Brisbois of Albany

Other survivors include his brother, Robert Lee Huggins and his wife Angela of Raleigh, NC along with numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his paternal grandparents, Frank and Liz Huggins and his maternal grandparents, Paul and Elsie Winter.
