Born in Lake Como, MS, Mr. Lee was the son the late Homer and Ethel Lee. He joined the United States Navy in 1944 and served on the USS Antedom from 1944 to 1948. In 1948, he joined the Albany Fire Department. For 35 years, he dedicated his life to the safety and well being of the citizens of Albany, GA. Mr. Lee retired as Battalion Chief in 1983. After retirement, he joined the Lee County Volunteer Fire Department and served as captain until its formal organization.
