Mr. Roy Alden Dunlap, 93, of Albany died June 29, 2016 at the Willson Hospice House.

His memorial service will be held Aug 5, 2016 11:00AM at St. Patrick's Episcopal Church.

Born January 31, 1923 in Central Falls, RI and moved to Albany in 1965. Mr. Dunlap retired from Coats and Clark after 41 years in 1983. He was a veteran of WWII serving in the Navy and a member of the American Legion Post 30. Mr. Dunlap was inducted into the Georgia Horseshoe Pitchers Association Hall of Fame in 1998.
