



Ruby C. Adams de Baca Obituary

June 9, 1909 - November 23, 2010

Mrs. Baca entered this world over a century ago in Plymouth, IL, as the daughter of Ray C. Adams and Ella Biswell Adams. At age 9 she survived the deadly flu epidemic of 1918. She and her sister Jewell attended W. Illinois University in Macomb to become teachers. After a brief teaching career, Ruby moved to Chicago where she met Ra \diamond l Baca, a career diplomat with the Mexican Foreign Service. Following their marriage, Mrs. Baca faithfully accompanied her husband on assignments that took them across the U.S. from consulates in San Diego to Philadelphia and crisscrossing the Atlantic from embassies in Germany to Costa Rica. After Mr. Baca's retirement, he and Mrs. Baca settled first in central Mexico and then in Phoenix, AZ, near her sister Jewell. It was in 2001 that Mrs. Baca, then widowed, came to Albany, GA at the invitation of her daughter and son-in-law, both of them professors at two regional universities. Her last nine years were spent by Mrs. Baca enjoying the comforts of her new home, the companionship of her next-of-kin, the taste of southern cooking and the scenic beauty of Southwest Georgia. As a young woman, Mrs. Baca was a talented artist and photographer; in recent years she expressed her talents by sewing. Mrs. Baca is survived by her loving daughter, Dr. Elena Baca Odio and son-in-law, Dr. Arnold Odio of Lee County, GA, along with many nieces and nephews living in Florida, Illinois, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Texas and Cuba.
